The BSW Program will be up for reaffirmation for accreditation in 2027, marking 40 years of Messiah's BSW Program accreditation. 2027 seems like a long time away, but all the necessary data and paperwork need to be submitted to CSWE by April 2026. The BSW Program is already gathering the needed data and paperwork in preparation for the reaffirmation accreditation process.

# CWEB Scholarship and Enhancement Fund

One of the biggest challenges faced by our students is the high cost of higher education. Many of our students work long hours to make ends meet while balancing their academic demands. The Program now has two scholarship opportunities specifically for our BSW students.

In collaboration with the Advancement Office, we now have a Social Work Education Enhancement Fund. This fund offers financial support for social work students to cover any field placement-related costs, such as transportation or field education management platform (Exxat). Please consider contributing to the Social Work Education Enhancement Fund here. 100% of the contributions go directly to the students to offset their field costs.

This August, Messiah's BSW
Program signed a partnership
agreement with the University of
Pittsburg's Child Welfare
Baccalaureates Program (CWEB
scholarship). The CWEB scholarship
offers full tuition reimbursement
and 8-month stipends in exchange
for a year of employment in a state
children and youth agency for
senior social work students. We are
excited to announce that our senior
student, Hannah Caruso, is the first
recipient of the CWEB scholarship
for the 2024-2025 academic year.


